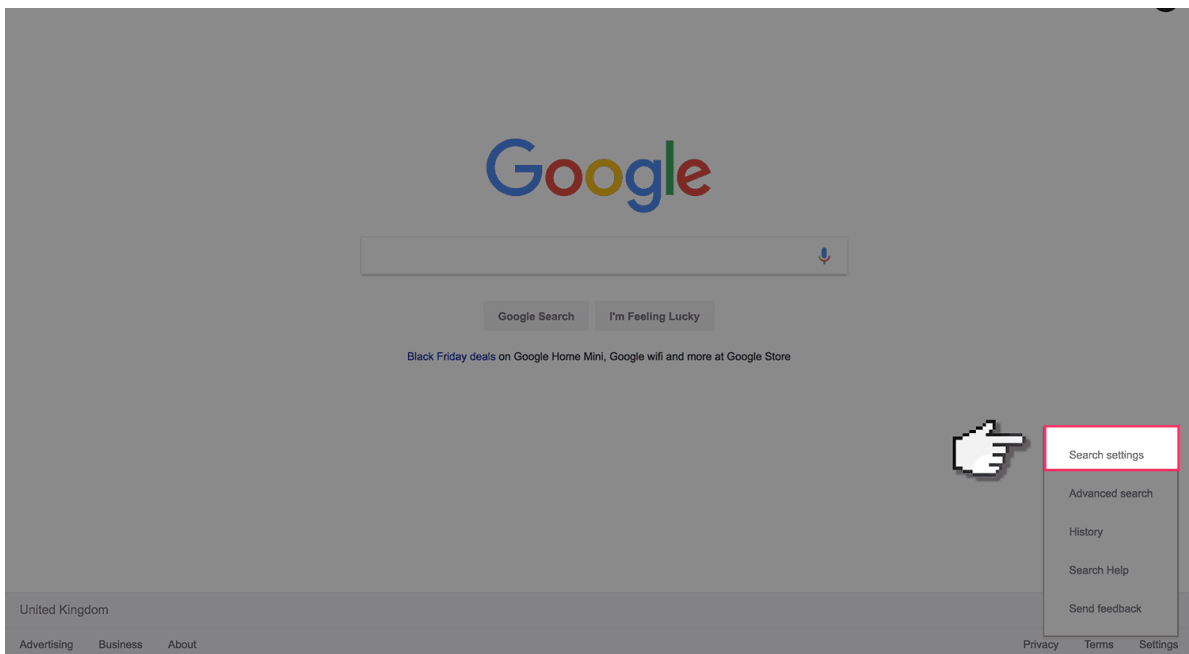

SafeSearch can be easily turned on for a single use, but for it to stay on you will need to lock SafeSearch. While on your browser go to [google.co.uk](https://www.google.co.uk) and click the 'Settings' tab and click on 'Search Settings'.

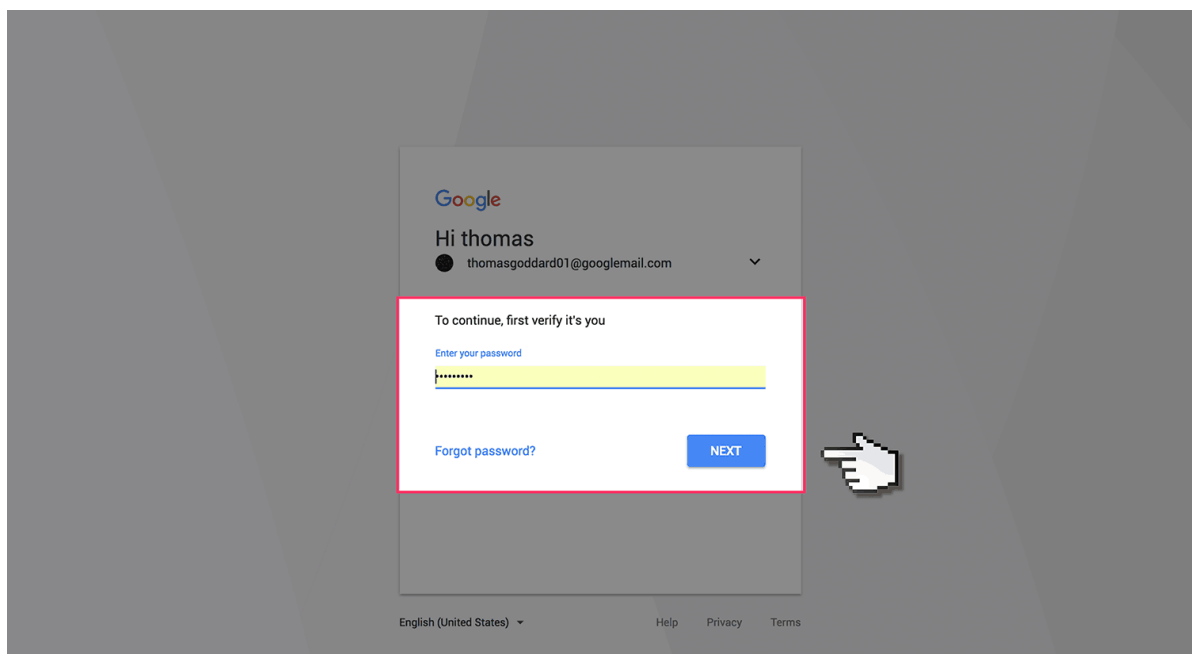
Find the “SafeSearch Filters” section and check the ‘Filter explicit results’ box, then click on ‘Lock SafeSearch’.
